

A Message from Pastor Alicia

A story is told about a farmer who was hoeing his garden by the side of the road when a stranger wandered up to the fence. "Farmer," said the stranger, "tell me about the people in that town just up the road What are they like?"

"Well, stranger," replied the farmer, "let me ask you a question. What were the people like in the town you just came from?"

"Oh," said the stranger, "those people. They were inhospitable, mean-spirited, stingy and just plain rude."

"Well," said the farmer, "I've got some bad news for you. The people in the town up the road are just like that."

"Pity," muttered the stranger, shaking his head as he continued his journey up the road.

A while later, as the farmer continued to hoe his garden, another stranger happened by. Approaching the fence he, too, hailed the farmer. "Farmer," he said, "tell me about the people in that town up the road. What are they like?"

"Well, stranger," replied the farmer, "let me ask you a question. What were the people like in the town you just came from?"

"Oh, they were wonderful people - good hearted, generous, and just as hospitable as they could be."

"Well, I've got some good news for you. The people in that town up the road, they're just like that, too."

The point of this story is obvious. It's about point of view. If one is positive and sees the best in people they've known or situations they've lived through, they'll see the best in people and situations they'll encounter in the future.

Now, lest I'm accused of being a purveyor of the power of positive thinking, as are some TV preachers, I want to assure you, I am not. I prefer to think of this story as a metaphor for good discipleship as members of the church. Again, it's about a person's point of view.

One person might view our congregation as a small family-sized church that is no longer in its hay day. "Why, 20 years ago," you might think, "there were about 100 people here on an average Sunday. Young families with lots of little kids were everywhere. Programs abounded, as well as fellowship activities. Today, however, we have an average of 68 people on a Sunday, and our congregation is aging. We must just be going down-hill."

However, another person might view our congregation differently. We are a small family-sized church, BUT, only five years ago our average Sunday attendance was 58, and now it's 68. We have lots of older folks, and we treasure them as they help us remember from whence we came. They are also an example of steadfast faith. We also have lots of young families. The sounds of children ring in our sanctuary on Sunday - a sign that we're alive and thriving. We have 9 youth grades 6-11. This year we will confirm 6 young people. The ringing of laughter comes from our crowded narthex as we fellowship after church each Sunday.

The quality of our music and worship far exceeds that of any church I have served, large or small. We are a welcoming group, holding out our arms to embrace those who would come seeking Jesus. Our stewardship is more than remarkable for a congregation our size. An average of 150 hungry souls come to our basement every Thursday, and they are filled with good food. Our Mission Endowment Fund has helped ministries of the congregation, community and synod. A brand new church van is being used in a variety of ways. The building has never looked better.

AND, we have a 10-year vision from God, from which God has birthed a strategic plan that is being implemented in more and more ways. So, I've got some good news for you. The people in that little church on Main Street in Xenia - they're growing in countless ways; and following God on a path to a bright future - and all by the power of the Holy Spirit. Thanks be to God!

First Lutheran Mission Endowment Fund

The First Evangelical Lutheran Church of Xenia, Ohio established a Mission Endowment Fund in 2006 and in the Spring of 2014 received a substantial anonymous cash gift from an estate. According to the guideline of the Endowment Fund, the fiscal year begins July 1st of the previous year and ends June 30th of the current year. At the end of each fiscal year, any profits earned from the funds invested (excluding the initial principal) are to be distributed to support different ministries and organizations.
